If you do not pre-enter a flat fee of \$10.00 will be charged.** NOTICE: Any person interfering with the ADGA Judge or Show Committee and/or disrupting the show will be dismissed from the show ring or the fairgrounds, and can be denied show privileges next year.

ENTRY FEE: \$ 7.00 per animal, each show

SHOWMANSHIP: \$ 2.00 per show

INSURANCE FEE: \$10.00 per exhibitor

PEN FEE: \$ 6.00 per pen (including tack pen) for the week end and there is a \$3.00 refunded if pens are cleaned.

If you have an animal that finishes on the first show and you scratch for the second show TCDGC will refund the entry fee for that animal. Refunds will be paid at check out.

## REGISTRATION AND RECORDATION CERTIFICATES:

1. Only goats registered with ADGA, AGS, or CGS; or that has applied for registration with these organizations are eligible to compete.
2. The original registration certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older and this MUST be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show
3. The original registration certificate or duplicate application stamped by the ADGA office is required for all animals under six months of age and this MUST be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show
4. No copies of the registration/recordation certificate or the stamped duplicate application, telegrams or phone calls will be accepted in lieu of the original certificate.
5. Only the I.D. on the registration/recordation certificate or on the stamped duplicate application is proof on ownership.

## HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

Colorado: Animals originating in state do not need a health certificate. Out-of-state: Animals originating out-of-state will need a health certificate listing your scrapies ID# and stating that the herd of origin is free of caseous lymphadenitis. **No Animals will be allowed on the fairgrounds exhibiting symptoms of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases such as but not limited to: external abscesses, ringworm, pinkeye and soremouth.**

Diseased or injured animals will be removed from the grounds upon recommendation of show committee. Animals deemed unworthy of competition by the show committee may be barred from competition and removed from the grounds. In such cases, the entry & pen fees will be forfeited.

**All goats must be dehorned or naturally polled**

FEED & BEDDING: None will be available.

ARRIVAL TIMES: Animals may arrive at any time after Noon on Friday. Show officials will be on hand from 5:00 PM to 8:00 PM Friday to check in paperwork, late Friday night arrivals can check in between 6:30 -8:00 AM Saturday morning. Does must be in place Friday night and checked in **before** the start of the show for the Saturday show. **THERE WILL BE NO CHANGES MADE IN ANY BREED AFTER THAT BREED HAS BEEN CALLED INTO THE SHOWRING!** NO show milkout. Exhibitors may milk out at their own discretion.

CHAMPION CHALLENGE: Permanent Champions may show in either the regular or Challenge class, whichever the owner chooses. The Grand Champion of the same show must show in the class, and the winner of it shall be called the Best of Breed. If the Grand Champion of the day does not win this class, she will not compete in the Best In Show class, and the winner of the Challenge Championship shall be the Prefix CH or GCH as affixed by ADGA to the animal's registration/recordation. **AN ANIMAL WINNING GRAND CHAMPION IN SHOWS WITHOUT CHAMPION CHALLENGE OR BEST OF BREED WHERE CHAMPION CHALLENGE IS CONTESTED WILL FORFEIT THE CHAMPION LEG EARNED THAT SHOW IF THEY FAIL TO COMPETE IN THE BEST OF SHOW CLASS.**

BASE DATE: The base date for classes is July 03, 2021.

BREED CODES: A (Alpine), L(LaMancha), N(Nubian), D(Nigerian Dwarf), AOP(All Other Purebreds), RG(Recorded Grades), T (Toggenburg).

SHOWMANSHIP: Years of age as of January 1. Pee Wee (7 years & under)/ Novice (new to showing, any age): This class is for fun only and does not qualify for CDGA youth awards and there is no charge. Junior: 8-10 Years of age, Intermediate: 11-13, & Senior: 14-19

Classes start at **7:00 PM Friday night**

**Covid-19:** Tri-County Goat Club request all exhibitors to follow all local and state Directed Health Measures and recommendation by CDC. At this time, that includes 6' social distancing, and the use of masks when inside a building. Exhibitors will be **REQUIRED** to wear a mask anytime they are in close physical contact with show staff and judges (i.e. tattoo reading & signing sanction papers). Please sign the Hold Harmless affirmation at the end of the entry form.

**Attention Exhibitors:** The fairground has rules that we must follow or we take the risk of not being able to rent the facility in the future.

- Goats are allowed only in the pen area and parking lot. Please do not take your goats on the midway, on the grassy area or around the Exhibit Hall. Renters and city folks don't like seeing goat poop scattered around the building or on walk way.
- Use **only** the restrooms inside the building section of Barn A. The other restrooms on the grounds are rented out to other groups who are responsible for any damages or injuries and they do not want the restrooms used by the goat exhibitors.
- Camping is permitted only at the campground. You can reach the Campground Host at 303-682-6762 for fees.
- Parking: Truck and Car parking in the lot east of Barn A behind concrete barrier. ALL livestock trailers must be parked in the area between the Camping Facility and Humane Society. Handicap people are exempted from this rule.
- Milk Disposal: Please dispose of all milk in the wash racks located between Barn B & Barn A. Do NOT dispose of any milk in the rest rooms, on the ground or in the ditch that runs along the road.
- Manure Disposal: Manure and pen waste can be dumped close to the concrete barrier east of Barn A. Please dump the waste close to the barrier so we have adequate space for driving trailers though to load animals and tack.

Please be considerate of your surroundings and other people; not everyone may have the same feelings about goats as you do.
